

MA Career Ladder Program: Guide to Understanding LPN Program Admissions

To participate in the MA Career Ladder Program, **you must first be accepted into a Licensed Practical Nursing (LPN) program** for the current admissions cycle (i.e., Fall 2024), in addition to meeting the other eligibility criteria.

If you are not yet accepted into an LPN program for Fall 2024 and/or are **thinking about applying in the near future**, this guide is for you.

Read each section below and follow the recommended next steps.

1. Consider which of the following eligible community colleges with approved LPN programs might be the easiest for you to commute to and attend in-person.

Many schools require in-person attendance. There may be select courses at certain schools that have hybrid or remote options. All schools except for Mount Wachusett Community College have a May deadline for Fall admission (September).

- Greenfield Community College (80 Locust St. Northampton, MA 01060)
- Holyoke Community College (Homestead Avenue, Holyoke, MA 01040)
- Massachusetts Bay Community College (College 19 Flagg Drive, Framingham, MA 01702)
- Mount Wachusett Community College (College 444 Green Street, Gardner, MA 01440)
 - Note: this is the only school with a Spring admission (January). The application deadline is November 1st.
- North Shore Community College (1 Ferncroft Road, Danvers, MA 01923)
- Northern Essex Community College (414 Common Street, Lawrence, MA 01840)
- Quinsigamond Community College (670 West Boylston Street, Worcester, MA 01606)

Recommended next steps:

1. Use Google Maps or another preferred app to understand your potential commute to and from a school
2. Pick your school(s) of interest

2. Explore the admissions requirements for your specific school(s)

Each LPN program has its own set of admissions requirements.

Though admissions requirements vary, they typically look to understand:

- Your English proficiency (through test scores or past transcripts)
- Your Math proficiency (through test scores or past transcripts)
- Your score on the [ATI TEAS](#) exam (common entrance exam for nursing school)
- Your completion of the required prerequisite courses and your grades in these courses
 - Prerequisites vary by school but often include college-level Psychology, Biology, and Anatomy & Physiology

3. Reach out to the specified Admissions contact to get additional information and support
4. **Note:** some schools hold mandatory information sessions. Sign up and attend those sessions for your school(s) of interest.
5. Jot down which requirements you still need to fulfill

3. Complete the MA Career Ladder Program application.

Great work on your school research so far! At this point, you should have a better sense of 1) which LPN programs you want to apply to, and 2) which admissions requirements you may still need to complete. Be sure to click on the school-specific links for the most updated information.

In the next few weeks, you will receive instructions via email on next steps for the MA Career Ladder Program application.

This will include:

1. A link to the MA Career Ladder Program application. The priority deadline is **June 14th, 2024**.
2. After you have submitted your MA Career Ladder Program application, JVS Boston will be in touch to schedule your screening and assessment.
